He enlisted in the Canadian Army July 1941, one month past his 19th birthday, and was with the troops for the liberation of Holland. After his return to Canada at the end of the war, he became engaged to and married his childhood sweetheart Mabel, April 6, 1946. He was a scout leader in the late 50's, past president of Milton Legion Branch 136, past master of St. Clair Lodge and was well known and respected around town. He was very proud of his service during WWII. He was born June 1, 1922 to Cyril and May Greenfield, in Ulceby, Lincolnshire, UK and was brought to Canada at the age of approximately 6 months.
